Who do you think you are?



Science

During our 'Separating Mixtures' topic, children will learn about the separation techniques of filtering, sieving and evaporation using sieves to separate materials of different sizes. They will understand that some substances dissolve in water whilst others do not. Children will also gain an understanding that they can separate a dissolved solid from a solution through evaporation of the liquid.

Computing

Year Five will cover the 'We are web developers' module. Children will select, use and combine a variety of software's to design and create a range of programs, systems and content that accomplish specific goals.

Physical Education

During PE this half term children will develop the fundamental skills required for striking and fielding games through rounders and cricket. Our ASPIRE sports coach will deliver OAA (Outdoor Adventurous Activities)

to support in developing motor skills, confidence and competence in the outdoor environment. Please ensure your child has their PE kit in school on a Monday and a Wednesday.

Our topic this half term is 'Who do you think you are?' Year 5 will explore famous Britons who have made an impact on history within Britain today. We will discover how the Victoria Sponge got its name as well as enjoy the delights of silent movies. Year 5 will learn about how Britain has changed through time.

English

In English this half term, the children will focus on writing a poetry with a narrative focus, an adventure narrative as well as a balanced discussion. We will be continuing to use the talk for writing approach to develop their vocabulary and sentence structure.

Maths

During this half term the children will continue to build on previously used skills and tackle problem solving. They will also begin to look at time, money and other number multi-step problems.

RE & PSHE

During this half term, in RE, Year 5 will study Sikhism through the key question: What is the best way for a Sikh to show commitment to God? Through the Jigsaw scheme 'Relationships". They will explore friendship goals, different types of relationships and communicating safely.
