Remember: You also have your English and Maths SATs Workbook and Revision Guides. The expectation is that you should complete one page a day.

Reading - Aim to do one a day

- Complete a reading task daily set on [satscompanion](https://satscompanion.com/) – your child will have an individual log-in (can be found inside exercise book)
- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the school library.
- Following this, ask your child to summarise the events (List the Gist – Who, What, Where, When, Why) from the chapter. They could bullet point what happened, create a comic strip or present the information in their own creative way.
- Encourage your child to note down any unfamiliar words from the chapter they have read. Explore the meanings of these words by using a dictionary, reading around the sentence or using an online dictionary.
- Challenge your child to read something around the house that isn’t a book.
- Watch [Newsround](https://www.bbc.com/news/newsround) and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding?

Writing - Aim to do one a day

- Ask your child to write a diary entry/newspaper report summarising the events from their day. They can write this from their own perspective.
- Your child can think about a member of their family who is a hero/heroine to them. They can then create an information report about their chosen hero/heroine. Why not encourage them to interview that person and include some direct quotes from the interview?
- What makes your family different to other families? What makes them the same? Ask your child to write a poem about their family, they may even want to perform it too. .
- **Children should only be allowed to watch TV for one hour a day.** Do you agree/disagree? Write a discussion (balanced argument) about this statement.
- **Story task:** Ask your child to design (can draw this too if they wish) a setting for a story genre of their choice. They can think about any settings that they have encountered in stories before. They must then write a short description including expanded noun phrases.

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Spelling and Grammar - Aim to do one a day

- Complete a SPAG task daily set on [satscompanion](#) – your child will have an individual log-in (can be found inside exercise book)
- Encourage your child to practise the Year 5/ 6 Common Exception Words
- Choose 5 Common Exception words. They can then write a synonym, antonym, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence.

Maths - Aim to do one a day

- Complete a maths task daily set on [satscompanion](#) – your child will have an individual log-in (can be found inside exercise book)
- Practise multiplication/division facts on Daily10 -Topmarks daily as well as working on [Times Table Rockstars](#).
- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything you know about addition and subtraction. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be.
