Maths	<p>Counting to 5 – point to each item as you count, then count 5 objects that cannot be moved. Show 5 on fingers. Watch the corresponding numberblocks episode, on BBC iPlayer or YouTube</p>	<p>Representing 5 – how many things can you count 5 of? Claps, fingers, toys, cups, count 5 of as many things from around your house as possible. Have a go at drawing 5 too.</p>	<p>Writing 5 – use chalk, sand, glitter, playdough to practise writing the number 5 before you use a pencil and write it on paper.</p>	<p>Finding 5 – go on a number hunt around your house to find the number 5. How many times can you see it?</p>	<p>Making 5 – how many different ways can you make the number 5? Eg 2 + 3 6 – 1 What is 1 more than 5 and 1 less than 5? Can I share out 5? Why?</p>
Understanding the World	<p>Autumn – make a piece of art work using natural Autumn objects you can find in or around your home and garden. Leaves, acorns, twigs, conkers or paint/colour/draw in autumn colours! Type ‘Autumn Art for Kids’ into google for inspiration!</p> <p>Don’t forget to talk about the changes happening, the animals hibernating and the weather getting colder!</p>
